



## SAN ELIZARIO STIMULUS FUND

Provided by CARES Act Funds in response to COVID-19

The City of San Elizario received Federal CARES Act funding as a sub-recipient from the County of El Paso and has created the San Elizario Stimulus Fund to help residents and for-profit businesses within San Elizario as they face hardship due to global pandemic, COVID-19. Eligibility and the application to receive \$250 is outlined below.

Individuals or businesses previously in receipt of CARES Act assistance or pending receipt of CARES Act assistance are not eligible for San Elizario Stimulus Funds.

### Eligibility Requirements:

#### INDIVIDUALS

- Primary residence must be within the City of San Elizario.
  - Acceptable documents for proof of residency: Identification card, utility in applicant's name.
- Valid social security number.
- Documented proof of being low-income or adversely affected by the Covid-19 Pandemic.
  - Acceptable documents for low-income status include: proof of tax filing for 2019, recent payroll check stub, proof of unemployment status. For proof of being adversely affected, documents must show a comparison between 2020 and 2019.
- Only one stimulus payment per household is allowed.

#### BUSINESSES

- The business must be located within the San Elizario city limits and be registered with the City of San Elizario.
  - Acceptable document could be the certificate of registration for 2020. The City will also have this information on file.
- The business must have been in operations since January 1, 2019 (in order to compare economic impact of the Covid 19 pandemic).
- Annual gross revenues for FY 2019 cannot reflect more than \$1,000,000
- The business will need to provide documented proof of being adversely affected by the Covid-19 Pandemic.
  - Acceptable documentation:
    - ♣ 2019 and 2020 (same month) Profit & Loss statement, or
    - ♣ 2019 & 2020 bank statement (same month).

#### NON-ELIGIBLE BUSINESSES

- Any business that derives more than one-third of its annual income from gambling activities.
- Any business that engages in illegal activities.
- Any business currently in an active bankruptcy.
- Church, religious institution or other non-profit organization.
- A government entity.
- Business with a past due liability or tax lien against your property in the City of San Elizario or County of El Paso, Texas.
