ORDINANCE NO. 1702.03A

ELECTION CANCELLATION ORDER AND ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN ELIZARIO, TEXAS ISSUING AN ORDER CANCELING THE MAY 6, 2017 REGULAR ELECTION; DECLARING UNOPPOSED CANDIDATES ELECTED TO OFFICE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of San Elizario ("City") is a general law municipality located in El Paso County; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with state law, a general election has been ordered for May 6, 2017 for the purpose of electing the following municipal officers: Alderson Place 1, Alderson Place 2 and Alderson Place 3 of the City; and

WHEREAS, no proposition is to appear on the ballot in the election; and

WHEREAS, the City Clerk has certified in writing that no person has made a declaration of write-in candidacy and that each candidate for each place on the ballot is unopposed for election to office; and

WHEREAS, the filing deadlines for placement on the ballot and declaration of write-in candidacy has passed; and

WHEREAS, Section 2.053(a) of the Texas Election Code authorizes the City Council to declare each unopposed candidate elected to office and to cancel the election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of San Elizario:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are adopted as facts and are incorporated fully herein.

Section 2. The May 6, 2017 municipal general election is hereby cancelled.

Section 3. The following candidates who are unopposed in the May 6, 2017 general election are hereby declared elected to office, and shall be issued a certificate of election:

Leticia Miranda Alderperson Place 1

David Cantu Alderperson Place 2

Miguel Najera, Jr. Alderperson Place 3

Section 4. The city clerk is directed to post a copy of this ordinance at each designated polling place on May 6, 2017.


Section 5. Repealer. All ordinances in conflict herewith or inconsistent with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters regulated herein.

Section 6. Severability. If for any reason any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part of this Ordinance is held invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by a court of law or administrative agency with jurisdiction over the matter, such action shall not affect any valid provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval.
