ORDINANCE NO. 1706.03B

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN ELIZARIO SETTING THE SALARY OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

RECITALS

- WHEREAS, the City of San Elizario ("City") was incorporated in 2014, and the City Council consists of the mayor and five aldermen; and
- WHEREAS, the Office of the Mayor is required to perform a number of duties outlined in state law as well as complete additional duties imposed and authorized by the City Council; and
- WHEREAS, Local Government Code Section 141.001(a)(1) provides for the imposition of a salary and any fees of the Office of the Mayor; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council finds that setting a salary for the Office of the Mayor is just and reasonable and benefits the citizens of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of San Elizario, Texas:

ARTICLE I. FINDINGS OF FACT

The foregoing recitals are adopted as facts and are incorporated fully herein.

ARTICLE II. ENACTMENT - MAYORAL SALARY

- A. The City Council of the City of San Elizario hereby sets an annual salary of \$ 20,000 for the Office of the Mayor.
- B. The salary shall be provided after the swearing in of the Mayor following the mayoral election of May 2018.
- C. The 2017-18 fiscal year budget shall be amended appropriately to reflect the salary.

Ordinance: Mayoral Compensation

ARTICLE III. REPEALER AND SEVERABILITY

REPEALER: All ordinances, or parts thereof, that are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters regulated, herein.

SEVERABILITY: Should any of the clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections or parts of this Ordinance be deemed invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by a court of law or administrative agency with jurisdiction over the matter, such action shall not be construed to affect any other valid portion of this Ordinance.

ARTICLE IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.
