RESOLUTION NO. 1711R.04A

RESOLUTION TO SUSPEND PROPOSED RATE INCREASE BY EL PASO ELECTRIC

RECITALS

WHEREAS, El Paso Electric Company (“EPE”) is an electric utility which distributes electric power pursuant to a franchise within the city limits of the City of San Elizario (“City”); and

WHEREAS, EPE submitted its Statement of Intent to the City to initiate a rate change proceeding, and on February 13, 2017, filed its *Application of El Paso Electric Company to Change Rates*, Docket No. 46831 before the Public Utility Commission of Texas; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to applicable law, the City maintains original jurisdiction over EPE rates charged within the city limits of the City and the application specifies that the rate change within the City’s jurisdiction should be effective on March 20, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that additional time and information is needed for it to study the proposed rate changes and tariffs and the reasons therefore;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Public Utility Regulatory Act, Texas Utilities Code Section 36.108, the City, as regulatory Authority, has the right to suspend the proposed rate change subject to the City’s jurisdiction for a period of 90 days after the proposed date the change would otherwise be effective; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of its citizens and ratepayers to suspend the proposed rate change.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of San Elizario, Texas, that:

I. The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted as facts and are incorporated fully herein.

2. The rate increase identified in the *Application of El Paso Electric Company to Change Rates*, Docket No. 46831 be and is hereby suspended for 90 days after the effective date for the rate increase subject to the City's jurisdiction as specified in the filing.
3. The Mayor or her designee shall so notify EPE of the suspension by having a copy of this resolution delivered or mailed to EPE.
4. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and adoption.

PASSED AND ADOPTED this, the 28 day of February, 2017, by a vote of 5 (ayes) to 0 (nays) to 0 (abstentions) of the City Council of San Elizario, Texas.
